LOCAL RULES BEAUCHIEF GOLF CLUB

1. OUT OF BOUNDS (Rule 27) A ball is out of bounds if it comes

A ball is out of bounds if it comes to rest: Beyond any hedge, fence, wall, line of white posts or ditch bounding the course, including the ditch left of the 10th fairway; the line of white posts right of the 18th hole; the wall separating the course from the Abbey Cemetery on the 4th hole = 0 no rebyond the footpath in the wood above the 1st, 2nd and 3rd holes. On or beyond the car park and any path, patio or flowerhed by the club house • When playing the 5th hole only: in or beyond the stream to the left of and parallel to the fairway. • When playing the 7th hole only: beyond the stream on the right as far as the line of white posts across the 8th fairway and then beyond that line • On or beyond the public road which divides the course. road which divides the course.

2. WATER HAZARDS (Rule 26)

2. WATER HAZARDS (Kille 26) The stream to the right of the 7th hole as far as the line defined by white posts, the stream to the right of the 8th hole and the ditch to the left of the 10th hole are Lateral Water Hazards. All other streams, ditches and ponds are Water Hazards. Bridges over hazards are in the hazard but may be touched by the club at or before addressing the hall addressing the ball.

3. IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS (Rule 24-2)

Buggy paths; directional and other notices, benches and waste bins when concreted-in; fairway marker posts; white posts defining internal out of bounds when playing holes to which they do not relate; fixed sprinkler heads.

4. STONES IN BUNKERS (Rule 24-1 These are movable obstructions.

5. PROTECTION OF YOUNG TREES If a tree, identified by a stake or white paint, interferes with a player's stance, or the area of intended swing, the ball must be lifted, without penalty and dropped in accordance with the procedure is plue 24 200 procedure in Rule 24-2b(i)

6. EMBEDDED BALL (Rule 25-2) Through the green, a ball embedded in its own pitchmark in the ground, other than sand, may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as possible to where it lay but not nearer the hole. The ball, when dropped, must first strike a part of the course through the green.

7. GROUND UNDER REPAIR (Rule 25-1) Any area of the course marked by white lines and/or by "GUR" is ground under repair from which play is prohibited.

8. RELIEF FROM AERATION HOLES On the putting green, a ball that comes to rest in or on an aeration hole may be placed at the nearest spot not nearer the hole that avoids the situation
